DRIVING DIRECTIONS

Franklin Center (February 6) 50 Claiborne Ave, Rocky Mount, VA

From Roanoke take US 220 South to first Rocky Mount exit. This exit puts you on North Main Street. Go 3-4 miles. You will come to a light that crosses old RR tracks and onto a bridge. Drive straight ahead (go past The Hub Restaurant), look for Claiborne Ave. on right (between Red Clay Cafe and Rocky Mount UMC). Turn right onto Claiborne Ave., go ½ mile to The Franklin Center on left.

Rockingham Fairgrounds (February 7) 4808 S. Valley Pike, Harrisonburg, VA

From I-81, take exit 243. Turn left on Rt. 11 South. The Fairgrounds will be 1.5 miles ahead on right.

Keystone Tractor & Truck Museum (February 8) 880 W. Roslyn Rd, Colonial Heights, VA

Take I-95 to the South Park Blvd exit (EXIT 53). The Museum is on the west side of I-95 about 1/2 mile north on Roslyn Road.
